- I will concentrate on teaching most of the topics in the textbook or according to the curricular requirement.
- I will always encourage my students to (re-)organise and develop their thoughts from the existing acquired knowledge to express their new ideas.
- In the process of teaching and learning, I will make use of difficult examples to stimulate or provoke students' critical thinking skills and engage them in debate activities.
- My lesson plans are designed for students to prepare for their examinations.
- I think that the most important reason of giving students good notes or demonstrations is to enhance their memories
- I think the materials required are adequate for teaching the students on how to deal with the examinations (including school/class tests)
- I feel that I should know all the answers for every question that the students raise.
- I provide opportunity for students to discuss the different interpretations of the subject matter.
- I feel that students should have their own notes or records of their learning.
- I think I should spend more of my teaching time to elicit responses from my students to facilitate the understanding of their ideas and thoughts of the subject matter taught to them.
